Also, ELAN is built on standardized, MEF-compliant Ethernet, making it easy to manage. TWCBC was one of the first service providers to earn MEF 14 Certification compliance from the Metro Ethernet Forum (MEF), furthering its credibility and reputation for deploying and managing Ethernet services.

In addition, TWCBC provides Dedicated Internet Access (DIA) to the main office, which uses it to deliver Internet service for each branch location. The company also serves the bank with Business Class Phone, an IP-enabled voice solution.
